1. Diploma in Ki Massage Therapy (I.H.C.A).

This course provides all the necessary training to become a professional Ki Massage Therapist. The course includes theoretical and practical instruction together with supervised clinical practice. The Diploma in Ki Massage qualifies the holder for membership of the Irish Health Culture Association.
