World Cup team-mate Dean Richards has already started an 18-month break to become a baby minder so that his wife Nicky can pursue her own business venture.



and McLaren.

They both want the flying Scotsman who has yet to win a Grand Prix but who has yet to finish outside the top five when he's got through a race without trouble.

And the race giants are ready to fork out fimillion for the likely lad off-loaded by Renault-Williams after problems behind the scenes.

He showed why yesterday by grabbing first qualifying pole position in the opening rehearsals for tomorrow's Italian Grand Prix here.

Afterwards he said: "Make no mistake — I'm going to win here.

"And if I were to go to Ferrari all those fans at Monza would be very pleased indeed if I was the winner."

He shoved team-mate Damon

Hill into third place behind second man Gerhard Berger. An overdue first win at Monza would clinch the ballistic kid's

And he told me: "I'm very happy — I know what's happening next season but an announcement will be made in weeks rather than days."

"As for this Sunday, I am really fired up for the race. And my confidence is on a real high."

Coulthard, regarded by three-

times world champion Jackie Stewart as a future title holder would only add: "I will be in a front line team next year—but I'm not saying who it will be." Ferrari have signed world champion Michael Schumacher—fourth quickest yesterday—on a £32million two-year deal.

They were scheduled to reveal his partner's identity this weekend.

But they have delayed it to give Coulthard, just 24, a big chance to win over their fanatical following on their home track.

McLaren hold a first-refusal on mighty David, but if 40-year-old Alain Prost makes a comeback they could dump their option.

Hill, 15 points behind Schumacher in the Championship chase said yesterday: "David's done a fine job and he is all fired up for Sunday."
