WORLD super-middleweight champion Steve Collins goes into tonight's defence against former titleholder Chris Eubank without a cuts man – because he's convinced he won't bleed!

Collins has been pumped up for the bout by hypnotherapist Dr Tony Quinn, the controversial character who got under Eubank's skin with his corner presence at their first fight.

Quinn, 49, has also brainwashed his fellow Dubliner into believing he can't

reel pain and won't suffer from any swellings. Quinn, who claims a Master of Science degree, has all but taken over Collins' preparation for fights, direct-ing his fitness programme, plus diet and nutrition planning.

But Quinn insists he doesn't control Collins' mind. "What I do is to get him to be in total control of his mind and completely relaxed.
