£52,000 bill for health authority

NORTHAMPTONSHIRE Health Authority has been billed for £52,000 by VAT inspectors.

The money will have to be found from the authority's budget for this year because the VAT rating has changed on continence medical supplies.

After August 1 the rating given on the supplies has gone from zero to the full 17.5 per cent.

The authority currently pays £440,000 for the continence service provided by Oxfordshire Community Health Trust. The number of people benefiting from the service and

the charge are set The VAT bill is set to increase for the next financial year to £78,000.

Peter Hildrew, director of communications at the health authority said: "The situation is that we have to supply con-tinence supplies when treatment is prescribed across the county. These are being supplied on a regular basis and Customs and Excise has decided that, after years in which these supplies were not subject to VAT, that they should be subject to VAT from August 1.

"We have not got the money, it was not budgeted for so it becomes an addition to the deficit that we are running and it sadds to the forevail are below part user."

and it adds to the financial problem next year.

He said: "I do not think we will at this point take any sudden action to cut anything else and we are not going to cut the service to the people who need it, they will not be penalised.

"But overall we have a deficit of over a million and we have to have a recovery plan and this will make the recov-ery much more difficult."

He added: "We are supposed to be financed to allow for any VAT charge but the effect of charging half way through the year is sleight of hand by Customs and Excise."
